## A HANDBRAKE TOO FAR FOR ME At the end of last season I

'van. I only managed to get away for one trip before laying it up for the winter



For less than £100 the garage extended the handbrake handle

months. However, it was soon apparent to me that I had a problem. On a hill start I could not operate the clutch and accelerator pedals and operate the handbrake smoothly and safely.

As many will know my campervan is built upon a Peugeot Boxer chassis. The problem for me was that the handbrake on this unit was too far down for me to release it without tilting my whole body over, thus depriving myself of proper pedal control and stability.

I am a small guy, but not that small – I guessed that the Boxer was really designed for orangoutans and I set about wondering how I could solve the problem. I put the problem to my local Hereford auto engineers called SMT Auto Services (01432 769486) who have MOD Accreditation. They understood my problem and my requirements. They manufactured a bracket and

cable extension which pitched the handbrake in easy reach at seat level. I was delighted to pay my bill which was less than £100 inclusive of VAT. They also supplied me with the mandatory Brake Test results and the recovered parts should I wish to reinstate the original, but
